441/442 High Peak	Buxton to Ashbourne via Hartington and Tissington. Approximately hourly Monday to Saturday from 7.00am to 5.30 pm
The Swift	Derby to Ashbourne via Brailsford. Approximately hourly from 730am to 1100 pm Monday to Saturday (9.30 am on Sundays). Serves Tissington Trail
110 & 111 Hulleys	Ashbourne to Matlock via Wirksworth. Approximately hourly Monday to Saturday from 7am to 5.30 pm
113 High Peak	Ashbourne to Belper, Approximately 2 hourly Monday to Saturday from 8am to 5pm

The park offers easy access by bus to lots of attractions and destinations. Take the short walk along the traffic free Tissington Trail to Ashbourne, buses depart from the bus station on King Edward Street.

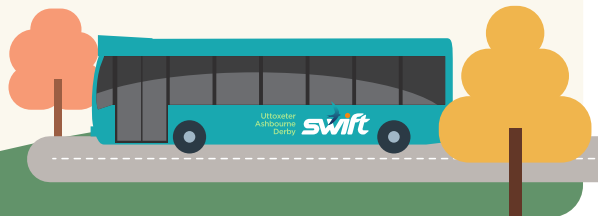
These are a few of our favourite places to visit during your stay –

Bakewell (change in Matlock)

Perhaps best known for its unique and delicious Pudding, Bakewell has many more tempting treats to offer - ranging from shopping and specialist markets to relaxing strolls and special events. Take a stroll through the town and discover scenic buildings, charming courtyards and pretty streets, or feed the ducks during a riverside stroll.

Belper Service 113

Visit the charming market town of Belper to discover the rich industrial heritage at the centre of the Derwent Valley World Heritage Site, universally recognised as the Cradle of the Industrial Revolution.





Buxton Services 441, 442

Famous for its 'healing' spa waters, visitors have travelled to bathe in Buxton's mineral waters for thousands of years but Buxton is also deservedly renowned for its beautiful Georgian and Victorian architecture.

Visitors to Buxton today can also appreciate the beautifully-landscaped and restored Pavilion Gardens, with its formal borders, lawns, play areas and family-friendly cafe and shop.

Carsington Water Service 111

With over 12kms of traffic free trails it's the perfect place to walk, run, ride your bike or horse around. There is a fully accessible short loop around Stone's Island or take the 12km Reservoir Trail for perfect views of the water. There is a watersports centre on site too!

Cromford Service 111

Explore the history of Cromford Mills and discover the captivating story of how the Derwent Valley changed the world in the 18th Century, uncover the secret's of this World Heritage Site in the mill yard, visitor centre and adjacent workers village in Cromford.

Matlock Services 110, 111

In the heart of Matlock sits the award-winning Hall Leys Park with its boating lake, riverside walks, tennis courts and skateboard park. With a high street full of small, independent shops, cafés, pubs and restaurants there's plenty of places to explore.

1.5 miles south of Matlock, Matlock Bath a popular destination for families, bikers and fun seekers, where there are lots of things to see and do.

Here you can take a cable car flight to the Heights of Abraham 60-acre hilltop park, with cavern tours, exhibitions, adventure play and much more.

Wirksworth Services 110, 111

With its imposing stone buildings and intricate network of narrow lanes, yards and alleys, Wirksworth is one of Derbyshire's prettiest market towns.

The Ecclesbourne Valley Railway operates services from Wirksworth to Duffield running through one of Derbyshire's most lovely and unspoilt valleys.

The spectacular Wirksworth StarDisc – a 21st century stone circle star chart – sits high above the town and illuminates the constellations at night.

The National Stone Centre and Mount Cook Adventure Centre lie on the edge of Wirksworth, and in the town itself St. Mary's Church – one of the finest in the county – is well worth a visit.
